2 Management Overview

2.1 Executive Summary

In the first part, this document aims at describing the dissemination events organised by the consortium during the first period of the project, i.e. the first eight months. The member who participated in the event describes it as stated in there. All those events have been supported by ACTIMAGE, the WP2 leader, by delivering presentations templates on request. More than that, the general management of those events are under the concerned member's responsibility with an important feedback made to ACTIMAGE to justify the human resource allocation.

In a second part, this document makes a state-of-art of the public website with the first results of the dissemination tools, newsletters and statistics.

The third part gives results in terms of efficiency of the internal communication facilities implemented on the private extranet.

The last part is a suggestion of plans for next dissemination initiatives.

2.2 Scope Statement

The scope of this deliverable is limited to the dissemination initiatives with feedback of the members. Some internal initiatives may not be quoted in it.

The evolution of the web tools are referring to the dissemination public website and the private extranet.

3 Introduction and Glossary

This document is divided into four parts.

The first part describes the events in chronological order. A short summary of the date, location, actors and goals of the event is made. For more information, one should refer to the member concerned by this event.

The second part describes the evolution of the public website with an orientation towards improvements in dissemination tools like newsletters, statistics and so on.

The third part gives a short feedback of the use of internal communication tools at the consortium's disposal.

The last part evokes some plans to continue and improve the dissemination activities for the next period of the project.

4 The EUPKI Dissemination Activities for the period covering April 2002 to November 2002

4.1 General dispositions for a dissemination initiative

4.1.1 Selection of the event

Any member of the EuPKI project can propose an event in which the presentation of the project would be appropriate. This should be proceeded by filling in the form, which can be accessed by clicking on the link "Add an event" in the "Events" section of the extranet. The WP2 leader is then informed and the relevance of the event is then discussed in the next Dissemination Board.

4.1.2 Organisation of the event: support of ACTIMAGE

As stated below, when WP2 members wish to attend a dissemination event, they contact ACTIMAGE, leader and supervisor of Work Package 2. If needed ACTIMAGE will help them to construct their talk by supplying any kind of presentation material they need such as Power Point presentations, posters, CDs, DVDs.

4.1.3 Feedback and points in Dissemination Boards

Once the event finished, the WP2 member gives feedback of the event to ACTIMAGE, the WP2 leader. By reporting the date, location and contacts established as well as indication of their global feeling, the WP2 members establish one management report, which will allocate the corresponding human resource.

4.2 The templates for the presentations

A typical Power Point presentation of the EuPKI project can be obtained by simply downloading it from the extranet in the "Events" section.

The ready-to-use Power Point template exists in both English and French versions. Of course, any WP2 member that wishes a more specific EuPKI presentation can ask ACTIMAGE for it.

4.3 Paris, on June, 20th 2002

ATICA organised the fourth "Workshop (studio) of the free" in Paris dedicated to the PKI management. Yann FRAVAL from GIP-MDS first presented the EuPKI project in that conference. The major points elaborated and discussed there were the objectives of the project, the actors and the consortium, the up-to-date achievements, the planning and the next steps of progress.

Then, Edouard Jeanson from Cap Gemini Ernst & Young made a presentation about the comparison of proprietary and Open Source solutions with realisation feedback and evolution perspective. Seventy persons attended this workshop and questions/answers were very vigorous but interested.

This efficient exhibition was to disseminate EuPKI initiative in a mainly political background of audience. The feedback was a sensitising about the future existence of European leading trustful (since Open Source) solutions.

4.4 Brussels, on June 24th-25th 2002

The European Commission invited delegates from the EuPKI project to intend one meeting dedicated to European Open Source Projects.

Christophe Megel from ACTIMAGE, Yann FRAVAL & Vincent GASS from GIP-MDS and Eduard TRIC from AXETEL attended this meeting, which was the occasion to get a global and complete review of the European activity around Open Source initiatives. Some contacts and bringing together have led to consider potential future collaborations.

One day was particularly dedicated to meet and discuss with other Open Source Projects dealing with security solutions: Ideal'X and Aegypton. The major conclusion of these meetings was the importance we should give to dissemination, exploitation and maintenance aspects.

4.5 Luxembourg, on August 30th 2002

Sebastien MISSENARD from ACTIMAGE established one contact with the Luxembourg Public Research Centre Henri Tudor. One meeting was organized to disseminate the EuPKI project with representatives from this Research centre. Vincent GASS from GIP-MDS attended this meeting too. Both presented the project, the achievements and the planning. One deep importance was given to the Technical Quality Management and a close analysis was made since one attendee was leading one PKI Opportunity Study for the interest of the Economy Luxembourg Ministry. We got proposed to join one special project team called "crypto" and working voluntarily for the CLUSSIL.

The major interest of that dissemination initiative was to make the Luxembourg government and institutions aware of the existence of such a project dealing with both Security and Open Source in a European Framework Program.

4.6 Paris, on September 13th 2002

Even if EDF, Gaz de France and RTE are separate entities, they share on a regular basis their experience in computer security. EuPKI (goals, consortium, means and so on) has been presented by EDF R&D in this frame to the security experts' community of the three companies.

Gaz de France, RTE were the potential contacts established.

Feedback: real interest of our partners. Posters could have been a plus for the communication.

4.7 Lyon, on September 20th 2002

Christophe MEGEL from ACTIMAGE and Vincent GASS from GIP-MDS presented the project to a community of scientists and university teachers at the Ecole Centrale de Lyon, one of the top 5 ranking schools of the French Grandes Ecoles.

The conference was mainly oriented through technical issues and objectives with a global share of points of view on the subject. The auditors got very interested about the European Commission commitment in Open Source projects promotion. Moreover they assumed the wish to participate actively in the deployment and exploitation phases of the project, for example by giving us the opportunity to test and validate the solution on their computers and networks infrastructures.

4.8 Palaiseau, on October 17th 2002

Paul-André Pays from On'X attended the X-Aristote seminar organized at Polytechnique (for more information see <http://www.aristote.asso.fr/>) devoted to PKI and Certificates and was allocated a few minutes to give a short presentation of both the EUPKI and the OpenEvidence projects.

Feedback:

- about 60 attendees from many of the largest organisations in France (both public and privates)
- they showed interest, but people are waiting for the first deliverables to possibly commit more
- we will keep the Aristote community informed when it will be time (something to deliver)

4.9 Marne-la-Vallée, on November 2nd-3rd-4th 2002

3. Conclusion: In spite of the fact that the presentation was made during the last day of the event, more than 50 persons were present. The presentation was considered as a good one by the moderator. We are now waiting for the official rating from ISSE.

4.10 Copenhagen, on November 4th-5th-6th 2002

The IST organised one major event in Copenhagen gathering all the actors of the European Scene dealing with RTD and past framework program projects. This was the occasion for Christophe MEGEL from ACTIMAGE and Vincent GASS from GIP-MDS to disseminate the main aspects of the project and meet other projects carriers. The main objective was to prepare the major dissemination initiative for EuPKI, which will be organised in Milan for the IST 2003 event occasion. Indeed, common interests have been thrown into relief with projects dealing with e-voting, e-administration and e-government in general which all need a security solution to secure their application system. Typically, contacts have been made with 5th FP projects, which will have deep implications and involvement when the project will consider exploitation and deployment phases.

4.11 November 2002

Cap Gemini Ernst & Young participated in the CISCO Secure Tour on the six following dates: November 12th in Strasbourg, November 19th in Lyon, November 21st in Marseille, November 26th in Toulouse, November 28th in Rennes, December 3rd in Paris. For the first time this meeting was not only aimed at retailers but also end-users.

Presentation made in the afternoon in the workshop. This workshop is awaiting 100 people (500 in Paris). Expected guests are among the 17 CST4 partners.

4.12 Other dissemination undertakings

- **Cap Gemini Ernst & Young** regularly present the EuPKI project when answering to invitations to tender on PKI (about two a month) and for each client interview (around 15 a month).
- **EDF R&D** presented the project in their internal newsletter. As member of the X-Aristote Committee, EDF R&D made the proposal to integrate an intervention about EuPKI during the conference on Certificates organized at Polytechnique the 17th of October 2002. This idea has been approved. Unfortunately, they have run out of time to schedule a complete presentation and they (the GIP-MDS, EDF & the program committee) decided finally to reserve a part of the meeting's conclusion/Q&A session for an intervention on EuPKI. M. Paul-Andre Pays, from On-X, made this communication. EDF R&D also participated in informal dissemination in the security community through regular conference attendance (RSA Conf, OSSIR meetings, IPv6 Conference...) through regular contacts with commercial security actors in our researches.
- Since the beginning of the project, **AQL** participated in twelve workshops / meetings dealing with security of new infrastructures, web services (state-of-the-art, stakes, experience feedback), security of inter-application exchanges. All in all, 250 persons attended those meetings located in Paris, Rennes, Nantes, Tours, Lille, Monaco et Sophia-Antipolis. Besides, AQL was also present at InfoSec 2002. During each meeting, Philippe Ensarguet, in charge of European projects, took five minutes of his time to introduce the EuPKI project and its actors.
- **Giesecke & Devrient** had a private interview in Bonn with BSI (Bundesamt für Informationssicherheit) in the summer. Three persons including the vice-president of BSI attended it and were asked for their support in the EuPKI project. Unfortunately, the BSI didn't positively answer to their demand but showed interest.

5 Evolution and first results of the Public Dissemination Tools

5.1 Evolution of the public website

5.1.1 General evolution

The public Website aims at disseminating the EuPKI project. It is the principal tool for that dissemination, by giving essential information about the consortium, the timeline of the project, the way it processes, the different milestones and the dissemination actions.

More than that, this site will host downloadable beta versions of EuPKI product as soon as it is available. A subscribing menu allows people to receive the bi-monthly newsletter of the project. The information that is displayed on that site is not confidential and mainly directed towards professionals or not. That is why one of the main attractions of this site is that it must be convivial.

The main contacts of the consortium are displayed and people who come across that website should find all the information they require to have a good knowledge of the project.

To have a thorough comprehension of the public website including its content and technical aspects, we refer you to the previous WP2 deliverable D.2.1 "Dissemination Tools Implementation Report". The next sections are devoted to draw up the list of the changes operated since the latter.

5.1.2 Specific Content evolution

Apart from some minor changes in the initial texts or images, one may also have noticed some improvement. For example, we have proceeded to some chapter reorganization in order to propose a more logical organisation of the presentation.

5.1.3 Referencing strategies and results

Keywords were introduced through met tags for an efficient referencing of the site in the most popular search engines.

It appears that the EuPKI website ranks first with Google.com, Yahoo.com, Lycos.com Altavista.com search engines. Unfortunately, apart from the Google French version, French-speaking search engines such as Yahoo.fr or Voila.fr have no record of the EuPKI website since its language is English. Some initiatives should be undertaken to put this right.

Cordis.lu, Libre.lu are also well-ranked.

5.2 The Newsletter

Three newsletters have been disseminated from the start of the project. The first one presented the launching of the project and its interests. The second gave a sum up of the six months work made by the EuPKI members since the beginning of the project and the forthcoming steps. Recent progress discussed on the second Steering Board meeting was accessible in the third newsletter.

Two newsletters are about to be disclosed and will go over the main points discussed on the third Steering Board (November, 26-27th) and the Review Meeting (December, 3rd).

When they subscribe to the newsletter, users give their name and society's name. It appears that, soon many other persons were interested in receiving it. We noticed several SSII names and two different Open Source associations.

5.3 The diffusion of the Deliverables

This section offers the user the ability to download EuPKI deliverables. Those deliverables are the same as the ones listed in the extranet apart from some that require being in perfect concordance with deliverables in progress from other work packages.

Statistics of the public website reveal for example that deliverables D.3.5 and D.3.6 have been downloaded respectively 21 times and 38 times in October.


Fig. 2 – Deliverables on public website

5.4 The suggestion of events on the public website

A new dissemination helper tool is available on the public website that enables any visitor to inform the WP2 leader of some events occurring on the PKI subject in which a WP2 member could take part.

This tool is in the guise of a form accessible from the link "Propose a new event" of the calendar view.

It is essential to realise that any visitor of the website can propose its own event. He should indicate as much information as possible (date, location, summary and link to the official website) in order to give full insight of the pertinence of the event. The proposition is then received by the WP2 leader and eventually appears on the public calendar if validated, guaranteeing that a WP2 member or any member of the consortium will attend this meeting and make a presentation.

5.5 The external communication: contact facilities

In order to provide easier contact between visitors of the website and members of the consortium, a specific email address has been created and appears on the website. Visitors that wish for more specific information can send an email to this address and the email once received by the WP2 leader is either answered directly or transferred to the member in charge of the question.

5.6 The logging stats of the public website

One section on the private extranet provides the consortium's members with a new statistic tool for the public website, enabling to identify the profile of a EuPKI website user.

The statistics shown on the private website are produced by a free web server log file analysis program called **Webalizer** written in C and distributed under the GNU General Public Licence. This program produces highly detailed reports in HTML formats.

The presentation of the statistics is twofold. First it gives the overall tendency of the popularity of the website for the last six months. Then, it presents the statistics as a monthly report which gives a comprehensive information about the usage of the website such as the number of pages read, the number of visits, the most read pages and the main sites that visit the website.

5.6.1.1 Global statistics

The overall tendency shown by the statistics is that the average number of visits a day is steady (around 21 a day) but the number of daily viewed page per person is decreasing. It can be assumed that visitors are used to the website and find the needed information faster.

On the table below are listed the total visits to EuPKI website and the number of viewed page for each month.

The statistics also reveal that more and more documents, such as deliverables of Work Package 3, are downloaded. For example, deliverables D.3.5 and D.3.6 have been downloaded respectively 21 times and 38 times.

Tuesdays around midday seems the perfect moment to visit the EuPKI website.

Country origin of website users can be disclosed in the statistic pages. The table below lists the top ten country users of the website since May 2002. France logically ranks first followed in fourth position by Romania and then Germany. On sixth position appears Luxembourg followed by Italy and then, startling again, Greece. United Kingdom and Netherlands are the last countries of this top ten. This sorting can be explained by the dissemination initiatives led in these countries.

Maximum activity was detected in September and October, maybe predicting that the best is to come.

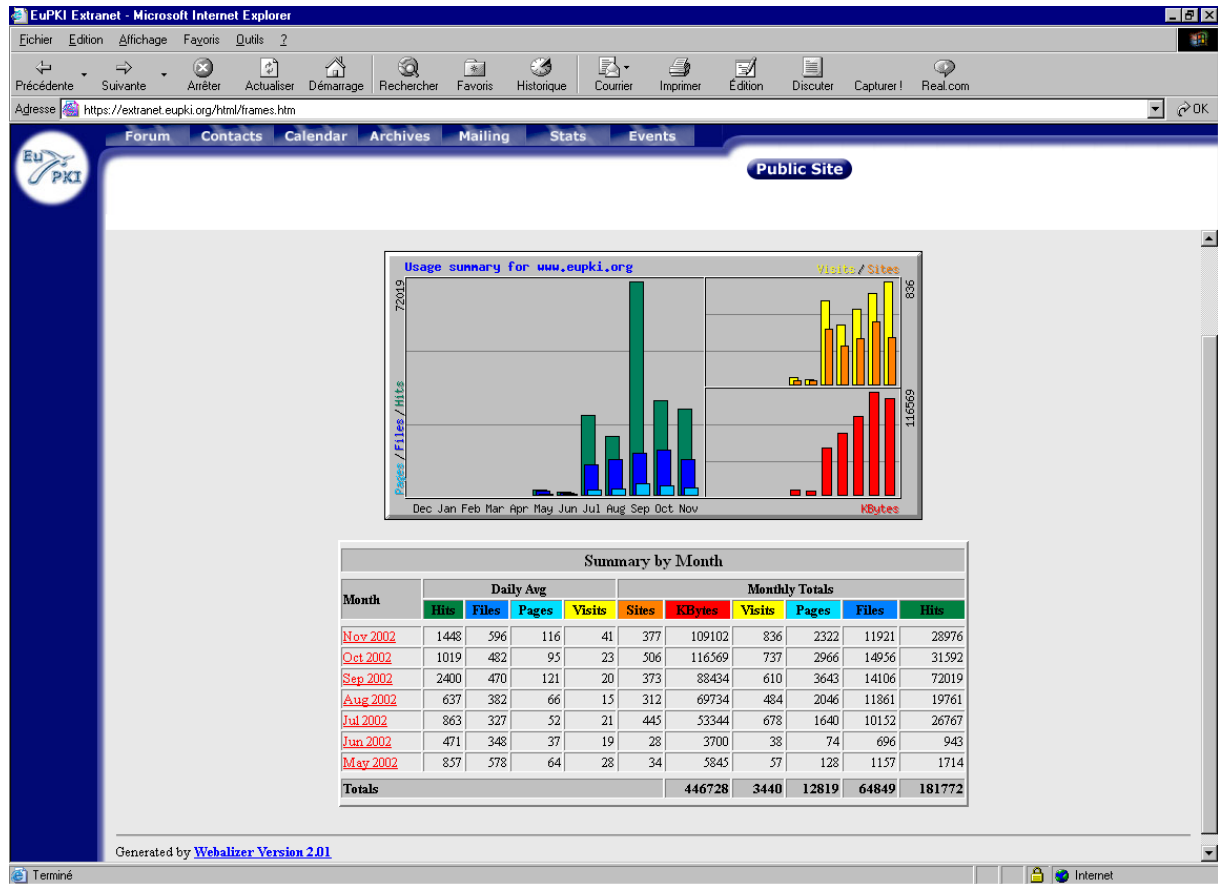


Fig. 4 – Global statistics on November, 20th

The monthly statistics gives comprehensive information about the website usage day by day that helps to interpret the overall tendency.

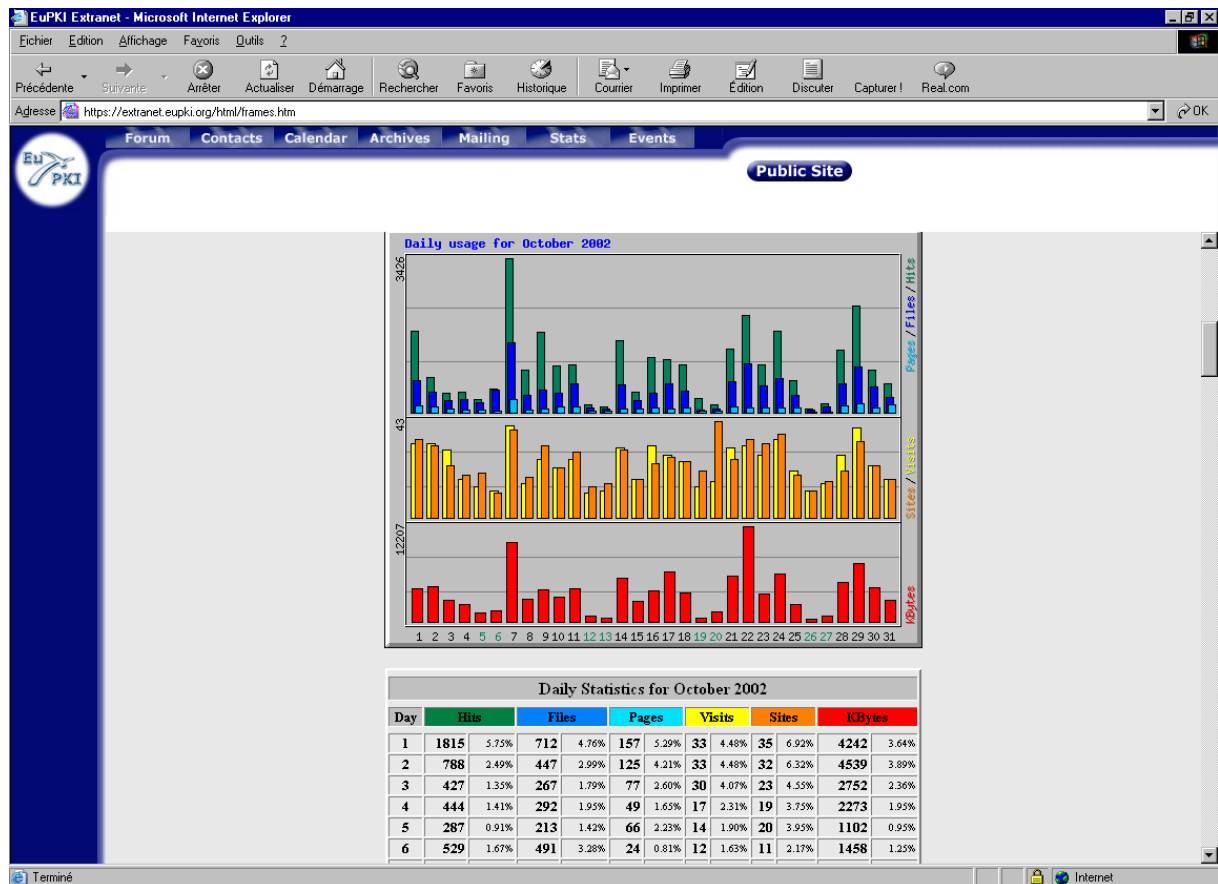


Fig. 5 – Monthly statistics

6 The internal communication facilities

6.1 The aim of the Private Extranet

The private extranet is a tool at the consortium's members' disposal to exchange data and documents all along the progress of the project.

It is only accessible to the consortium's members and requires an authentication on logon.

More tools can be developed according to the members' desiderata to facilitate the communication inside all working groups.

As for the public website, the following sections will take the specifications and presentations given in D.2.1 for granted and will focus on pointing out the major changes or evolutions made since then.

6.2 Communication tools implemented and efficiency

6.2.1 Forum

The forum is a classical one with important functionalities added, like an attachment module. It allows the users to download and upload documents drafts to correct / modify them as many times as desired. This functionality allows a Work Package working together to elaborate a deliverable or a report.

Within WP3, the efficiency of this functionality is obvious, the proposal of a draft giving birth of technical brainstorming.

This is also a place where members can give feedback about the website or give information about new and various events. Since the beginning of this section, the forum received 12 discussions and 23 messages.

6.2.2 Agenda

This planning is provided to display all the meetings, deadlines and milestones of the project. It allows members to suggest a meeting and mail an invitation to the members he wants to invite. The dynamical planning allows attaching documents to each event pointed on it, like meeting reports for a meeting event. The members can consult these documents.

This functionality is widely used inside WP3 and WP4 mostly, sometimes including the associated minute afterwards. At this point in time, 22 meetings appear on the calendar and 7 associated minutes.


